



Compliance Checklist for Florida Radiation Protection Program Compliance

Use the checklist below to quickly assess whether your facility meets **Florida Rule 64E-5.303** requirements for non-medical X-ray registrants:

Radiation Protection Program (RPP)

- Written on-site Radiation Protection Program is developed
- RPP is implemented in daily operations
- RPP is available for inspection
- Recordkeeping complies with Rule 64E-5.335

ALARA (As Low As Reasonably Achievable)

- ALARA policy is clearly stated in the RPP
- Engineering controls (shielding, barriers, equipment placement) are in place
- Written operating and safety procedures are followed
- Operators receive appropriate radiation safety training
- Radiation surveys or evaluations are performed, as required

Occupational and Public Dose Control

- Worker exposure is assessed and monitored, if required\ld
- Public access is restricted
- Warning signs are posted, where required

Annual Review Requirement

- RPP reviewed within the last 12 months
- Surveys are performed when changes in equipment
- Review is documented and dated

Documentation available for inspection

- Required records are organized and current
- Staff know where radiation safety documents are kept
- Corrective actions from past inspections are documented
